## **Background**

There are over 850,000 people living with dementia in the UK. This figure will increase to over a million by 2021.

## **Environment**

People living with dementia can find it difficult to understand signage and require addtional help to find their way. Small changes can have a big impact on improving accessibility.

#### **Signage**

# **Appointments**

Here are some suggestions about how to book appointments in a more dementia friendly way.

- Ensure your appointments system is user friendly
- Offer double appointments. Communication and understanding is often an issue for people living with dementia - give people extra time to enable better consultation.
- Remind the patient with a dementia diagnosis, or their care partner, of their appointment via a pre appointment telephone call if required.
