1.	<p><b>Welcome, Introductions &amp; Housekeeping, Rebecca Campbell, Quality Improvement Manager, Y&amp;H Clinical Networks</b></p> <p>Rebecca Campbell welcomed everyone to the meeting and conducted introductions. 2.	<p><b>National and Regional Update, Moggie McGowan, Co-Chair, Clinical Advisor (Y&amp;H IRIS &amp; NHS England North)</b></p> <p><b>National Update:</b> Moggie McGowan presented a national update on behalf of Jay Nairn from the National Team. Moggie McGowan advised the attendees that the use of the Unify System has been extended for a short while to ensure that the MHSDS system is working correctly. Moggie McGowan also advised that there will be a shift in performance measurements towards using SNOMED codes. SNOMED codes will tell the story regarding outcomes and so it is essential that people use the codes correctly.</p> <p>Moggie McGowan noted that the self-assessment outcomes have been shared and a second self-assessment will begin soon, most likely in the Autumn.</p> <p>Moggie McGowan also highlighted that further work is required on workforce, including care co-ordinators, nurses, social workers etc. However, there is a shortfall in available, trained staff. It was also noted that the expansion of EI services to the full age range is being debated nationally and it was noted that all services should be providing ARMS.</p> <p>Lastly, Moggie McGowan advised the attendees that the Mental Health Dashboard is being regularly completed and will be utilised as a performance management tool regarding spend by CCGs on EIP services. It was enquired when the dashboard has been completed from and noted that quarter one has been submitted and quarter two will be updated and shared shortly.</p> <p><b><i>ACTION: Clinical Network to share a link to the Mental Health Dashboard.</i></b></p> <p><b>Regional Update:</b> Moggie McGowan provided an overview of the outcomes of the recent deep dive visits and highlighted the main themes that emerged from the visits. 	<p>noted as a key issue, which is now being debated nationally. Moggie McGowan also provided an overview of the next steps from the deep dive visits and advised regarding the funding, which has been allocated into CCG baselines.</p> <p>Moggie McGowan also provided an overview of the CCQI standards for EIP services. Moggie McGowan advised that a survey of team managers had been conducted ranking the current standards as higher, medium or lower importance and the feedback indicated that the team managers found CBT for psychosis and rapid services as being of higher importance.</p> <p>Moggie McGowan advised that there is no funding for training this year but there will be funding next year. Kerry Smith advised that in Hull, local funding will sustain the course, and then future funding should be for wider mental health staff not just for EIP staff.
