1.	<p>Welcome, introductions, housekeeping and introductions to Slido – Denise Friend, Quality Improvement Lead, Yorkshire and the Humber Clinical Networks</p> <p>Denise Friend welcomed everyone to the North East and Yorkshire & the Humber EIP Networks MS Teams meeting and thanked them for attending.</p>	
2.	<p>Update on the Phase 3 recovery planning for EIP, Long Term Plan ambitions, new guidelines, NCAP Audit and training – Moggie McGowan, Co-chair, Y&H IRIS, Clinical Advisor Y&H Clinical Network and NHS England North</p> <p>Moggie McGowan welcomed everyone to the meeting and stated “this is us getting back to normal.”</p> <p>Moggie McGowan presented to the attendees on the Phase 3 recovery plan, the long term plan ambitions, new guidelines, NCAP audit and training.</p> <p>The key messages for EIP are:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • We are beginning to see increased acuity in presentations to our services. • We must use the Phase 3 planning process to ensure we invest across the entire health pathway, and not just in beds. This means investment in alternatives to admission and strengthening and investing in community services. • The role of digital transformation must be a central feature of this planning exercise as it offers a major opportunity to modernise care. However, in many cases, it should not be a replacement for face-to-face support. • As of Q2 2020/21, national assurance activity and data collections will resume with performance being discussed in the quarterly deep dives. • Systems are required to triangulate activity, finance and workforce trajectories and produced a plan that is feasible in the post-pandemic context. • Workforce growth remains the key enabler. • This is how we will transform the quality and reach of mental health care in this country. <p>Please see the presentation slide pack for more information.</p> <p>Action: Can all services please send their NCAP score to Moggie McGowan – stephen.mcgowan@nhs.net as soon as they receive it.</p> <p>Question: Will the additional funding be going into CCG baselines rather than going specifically for EI or has that changed? Answer: Moggie McGowan replied that 20/21 (this year) funding for EIP is ringfenced (please see the table in the presentation slide pack). Thereafter funding for EIP is within the overall £1bn community MH transformation fund so will need competing for.</p>	<p>All</p>

	<p>Question: When do the bids need to be put in by? Answer: Moggie McGowan confirmed that the deadline was 21 September 2020.</p> <p>Question: What is the timescale for the publication of national ARMS guidance as it would be helpful in potentially directing additional ringfenced funding? Answer: Moggie McGowan replied that the original date was in September but agreed to raise it on the EIP regional leads meeting schedule for 19 September.</p> <p>Question: Is there was any indication about when we will be audited on ARMS? NCAP only focused on FEP. Answer: Moggie McGowan confirmed that it has been raised as a potential supplementary question on ARMS and CYP but there are currently no plans for it to be part of NCAP which is based on NICE guidelines.</p> <p>Question: Physical Health within NCAP currently does not evidence quality of interventions or actions followed up and needs some additional audit questions within the audit. Answer: Moggie McGowan agreed the NCAP audit has limitations and suggested that attendees should share their concerns with NCAP.</p>
